# A Note on OCS and Z Flag Penalties

This note clarifies how the WNS will address **Z Flag penalties** and **OCS (On Course Side)** situations during races.

# Relevant Rules from the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS):

#### **Definition of Start**

A boat starts when, her hull having been entirely on the pre-start side of the starting line at or after her starting signal, and having complied with rule 30.1 if it applies, any part of her hull crosses the starting line from the pre-start side of the course side.

#### 29.1. Individual Recall

When, at a boat's starting signal, any part of her hull is on the course side of the starting line or she must comply with rule 30.1, the race committee shall promptly display **flag X** with one sound signal.

- The flag will remain displayed until:
  - 1. The hull of each boat has returned completely to the pre-start side of the starting line or its extensions.
  - 2. Each boat has complied with rule 30.1 (if applicable).
- However, the flag will be lowered no later than:
  - Four minutes after the starting signal, or
  - o One minute before any subsequent starting signal, whichever comes first.
- If rules 29.2, 30.3, or 30.4 apply, this rule does not.

## 30.2. Z Flag Rule

#### If **flag Z** is displayed:

- No part of a boat's hull may enter the triangle formed by the starting line and the first mark during the last minute before her starting signal.
- If a boat breaks this rule and is identified, she will receive, without a hearing, a **20% Scoring Penalty** as outlined in rule 44.3(c).

#### **Key Points about the Z Flag Rule:**

- 1. The penalty applies even if the race is restarted or re-sailed, but not if it is postponed or abandoned before the starting signal.
- 2. If a boat is identified breaking the Z Flag Rule in a subsequent attempt to start the same race, she will receive an additional 20% Scoring Penalty.

- 3. The boat will not be scored worse than "Did Not Finish" (DNF).
- 4. If boats break the Z Flag Rule but there is no General Recall, those boats will receive an Individual Recall and be treated under **RRS 29.1** and **RRS 30.2**. and will therefore be required to return completely to the pre-start side of the starting line or its extensions.

## **Example of a Z Flag Penalty Calculation:**

- Regatta Details: 54 boats entered.
- 20% Scoring Penalty:
  - 20% of 54 boats = 10.8, rounded to the nearest whole number = 11 places.

## Scenario:

- A boat infringes the Z Flag Rule and finishes 17th.
- Her final score for that race will be: 17 + 11 = 28.

By ensuring all competitors understand these rules, we aim to maintain fair competition and consistent application of penalties during the WNS.
